Empower is a community project funded through the Big Lottery Reaching Out Supporting Families Programme.


Dyslexia, Autism, and Dyspraxia support, (DADS), is the lead partner. The focus of the Empower Project is:

- Support children under 12 with Autism, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia
- Support parents and the wider family circle
- To enhance confidence, create opportunities to learn together and to develop skills
- Build relationships and share best practice









The project targets 4 groups:

- Parents
- Wider Family Circle
- Children & Young People under 12
- Wider Stakeholders to include health and educational professionals, schools, childcare providers and voluntary groups wishing to work with children with Autism, Dyslexia or Dyspraxia

The project commences September 2015, and is a five year project focusing on the Magherafelt and Antrim areas.

How does Empower work?

- Provision of Training Courses as identified by parents where support is required
- Learner Buddy Hubs In school and community venues working with young people to support development of Literacy/Numeracy/Social skills
- Social Activities for young people e.g. Club Ausome - youth club with young people with ASD, provision over school holiday periods
- Training to Support Schools assisting schools to access up to date training and awareness raising programmes
- Relaxation Programmes provision of time out for parents/carers through coffee mornings, pamper sessions, mindfulness workshops etc
- Information Line to support families in need of information/support
- Partnership Working with the statutory and community sectors
